Celestial: January 28 - Full Moon. The Moon will be located on the opposite side of the Earth as the Sun and its face will be fully illuminated. This phase occurs at 19:18 UTC. (00:18 EST Jan-29) This full moon was known by early Native American tribes as the **Wolf Moon** because this was the time of year when hungry wolf packs howled outside their camps. This moon has also been known as the Old Moon and the Moon After Yule.
